6.Jasons proposal for dividing the existing communal shower. (View Appendix 3 below.)	JC	 a) As there is not enough space in the existing communal showers for cubicles, Jason proposed erecting shower curtains and rails to enable some privacy if required. b) At least 2 but possibly 3 areas could be created. These could be tied back when people are happy to use the shower communally. Motion: Jason to be given the authority to purchase the necessary material to create 2 or 3 areas within the communal showers to enable the area to be divided by shower curtains. For - 7 Against -0 Abs -0 Motion carried
7.Dan to describe proposed digital booking system in the new Tackle Store	DM	 a) The new Tackle Log will be digital using the App "Gear Log" b) A tablet is now available in the Tackle Store to record gear out and returned. c) WiFi will need to be upgraded to enable a better signal in the Tackle Store (JC investigating) d) Records can be monitored by Dan remotely. e) Frequency of use, purchase dates, condition notes and stock taking can be easily maintained. f) A log book will still be available for those who wish to use a manual system, and Dan will transfer any data to Gear Log g) As the tackle store is now more vulnerable to break-ins, being outside the cottage, a motion sensitive CCTV camera has been installed. Notices will be put on the door and inside the Tackle store saying that CCTV is in operation.
8.Lounge paint colour survey and lounge curtains (View Appendix 4 below)	DL	 a) There were 26 responses. b) Option 8 was the most popular with 9 votes. c) Jasmine White in the Dulux range was the nearest match. d) Jason has already purchased the paint and painted the lounge. e) As Jason was at the cottage for the Zoom meeting he gave us a guided video tour. f) We need new lounge curtains which NP will source.

Appendix 1. Sophie Lossls report on shower options

Mendip Caving Group - Shower/Changing facilities

Issue – MCG Communal showers/changing provide insufficient privacy for men/women, and younger groups such as Scouts or schools.

From my initial look at the space, to meet your criteria, you have 3 options:-

- 1. Using the existing space: The only way to divide the communal shower into 2 cubicles is to lose the toilet next to the shower space. This would mean creating 2 new doorways into the shower area, one from the corridor, and one from the toilet cubicle.
 - In addition, you could convert of the old tackle store into a standard shower-cubicle with toilet and hand basin. There should still be enough room for 1 person to change in this area.
 - However, to reach the new shower room, people would need to pass through the communal changing area. This does not enable separation of male and female ablutions, and when letting out to youth groups, there won't be fully separate adult/youth areas.
 - Additionally you could provide a shower in the 8-room. There are currently 2 basins in an alcove in the 8-room. This could be partitioned off with a simple stud wall, providing space for a shower and washbasin. A small velux or light-well would be recommended. Services are already in place.
- 2. Converting the library into a shower/toilet/changing area and moving the library/office to a newly erected space in the garden. I would suggest use of a prefabricated "garden office". These buildings are readily available in a variety of sizes and come fully insulated. A typical off-the-shelf timber office, 3m X 2.5m, is about £12,000. A custom sized one for the club requirements may be about £20,000 fully installed and finished (Full research needed).
 - The existing communal shower, with the addition of the "tackle store" shower could then be the Male area, with the new area reserved for Women. The build time for this solution would short, minimising disruption to the Club. I understand that the cesspit is near to the existing library, which would keep costs down.
 - This solution should future proof the club requirements and take full account of child protection and adult privacy needs.
- 3. A traditional extension off the current location of your shower area. This would be invasive into the buildings structure and would mean re-working of some internal walls to create a better use of space and to gain access to the new extension. RSJ's would be needed to support load bearing walls and planning may be more of an issue. A structural surveyor would be highly advised. Exactly how to divide the space would be looked at if this was the preferred option.

Notes:

These notes are made without a full floor-plan survey.

Any costs mentioned are subject to confirmation.

Options 2 and 3 would better enable full disabled access.

From my brief assessment of the external space, building an extension adjacent to the existing showers would impact off road parking and vehicle manoeuvrability.

Solutions 2 and 3 may generate additional booking income as the MCG could be marketed to a wider range of youth groups and schools. With some active marketing it may be attractive to 6th form groups who wish to undertake A-level fieldwork.



Below: Impression of what the extended cottage may look like form the road.




Below: Plan of Ground Floor
